2019/20 Pupil Premium Grant Allocation

What is the Pupil Premium Grant?

- The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is the name of the funding given directly to schools to support students who receive free school meals, who are in public care or young people whose parents are in the armed forces.
- In 2019/20 all schools receive £935 for each student covered by the PPG.
- South Bank UTC has 43 students for whom it receives the PPG. This generates a total PPG income of £40,205

What are the barriers to learning for the South Bank UTC Pupil Premium Cohort?

- Poor attendance
- Complex and challenging home lives
- Poor literacy and numeracy skills
- High FTEs at previous schools and/or previously home schooled
- Unable to afford resources to support revision at home

How did South Bank UTC use the Pupil Premium Grant to address these barriers to learning and what impact did this have?
