



The Need for Hospitality, Catering and Tourism Roles

The sector employs 3.64 million people (3.2 million roles classed as hospitality)

There are 42,477 full service restaurants in the UK in 2023, employing over 475,000 people.

There are 6,752 catering businesses, employing 28,956 people, and generating £1.3 billion of revenue.

London alone has 22,316 licensed pub, bar and restaurant sites.

The Hospitality sector is worth £131.5 billion to the UK economy.

Travel, Tourism and Hospitality in the UK is worth £237 billion to the UK's GDP.





An Introduction to Hospitality, Catering and Tourism

It's been said that when you work in hospitality and catering, or travel and tourism, you're at work when others are at play; but with a wide range of fast-paced, exciting and rewarding careers on offer - for the right person - going to work could be just as enjoyable as taking a holiday.

Although the hospitality and catering, and travel and tourism sectors offer their own unique career opportunities, they are intrinsically linked and combine to form one enormous, dynamic and hugely varied industry; commonly referred to as travel, tourism and hospitality.

With careers as varied as hotel and events management, travel agency and tour management, restaurant and catering management, and cooking and baking - if you have a talent for providing exceptional service and a passion for meeting people this could be the perfect pathway for you.



Is Hospitality, Catering and Tourism the Right Pathway for You?

Gaining the necessary qualifications, and undertaking placements, can teach you the knowledge and expertise you will need in this sector, but there are a number of personal qualities and transferrable skills that are essential for a successful and rewarding career in the Hospitality, Catering and Tourism industry.

You will need a combination of the following qualities: excellent communication, listening and interpersonal skills; exceptional levels of customer service; confidence and an approachable manner; good cooperation and team working skills; the ability to work well under pressure and to tight deadlines; a willingness to work unsocial hours; strong organisational and timemanagement skills, with a keen attention to detail; sales, marketing, and project management skills; great administrative and IT skills; excellent technical cooking skills, with a broad knowledge of ingredients and cooking techniques; high standards of cleanliness, and the ability to adhere to strict food hygiene and health and safety rules; tact and diplomacy when handling staff and customers; the ability to work independently and be a confident decision-maker; the ability to think quickly and solve problems on-the-go; possess a flexible and hands-on approach to work; and have high-levels of selfmotivation, energy and enthusiasm.

Careers in Hospitality, Catering and Tourism

From the people who take your holiday or hotel booking, to the crew who man your flight, to the chefs who prepare your food, to the waiting staff who serve you, to the people who plan and organise your events; the world of hospitality, catering and tourism is enormously far-reaching.

So, it's no wonder that it accounts for over 3.6 million jobs nationally, and over 600,000 jobs in London.

The hospitality, catering and tourism sectors are experiencing a huge resurgence and seeing mass-scale growth throughout; making it the perfect time to embark on your new career pathway in this hugely varied industry.

We are currently seeing a 46% increase in demand for hospitality workers compared to pre-pandemic levels nationally: with over 50,000 newly listed job vacancies at the start of 2023, and 10,460 of these new vacancies being in London.

It's clear to see that this vital industry has huge demand for well-trained, qualified recruits in positions of all levels, from graduate schemes and managerial positions that require a degree, to more entry-level positions with the opportunity for hands-on experience and advancement. No matter where your skills, passions, and abilities lay, you're sure to find your place in this exciting, dynamic and hugely-varied industry.

The salary for Air Cabin Crew starts at around £19k once qualified, increasing to £23k with experience, and up to £28k with performance bonuses. Catering Manager salaries range from £22k (for assistant managers) up to £45k with significant experience, while heads of catering and operations directors can earn up to £65k p.a. The average wage for a Chef depends on their level and the venue in which they work. A commis chef may earn around £16k, a sous chef can earn up to £30k, while a head chef's salary can exceed £55k per year; An experienced Food Technologist can earn around £45k, or even more than £50k for senior management roles. Hotel Managers can earn anywhere between £20k to £40k per year, while as a general manager in London, you could earn £85k p.a. on average, with a range of £50k to £200k for the largest, most prestigious hotels. An **Events Manager** can earn in excess of £40k a year.
